Bio blurb: A Professor of Medicine in the Division of Geriatrics and Department of Pharmacy and Therapeutics at the University of Pittsburgh, Dr Hanlon is also a geriatric pharmacist and Health Scientist with both the Center for Health Equity Research and Promotion (CHERP) and the Geriatric Research Education and Clinical Center (GRECC) at the Pittsburgh VA. His research focuses on three themes: 1) drug-related problems; 2) racial disparities in medication use; and 3) drug-induced geriatric syndromes. He serves as a PI and Co-I on a number of federally-funded grants and on the editorial board of several journals. Dr. Hanlon is the developer of the widely studied Medication Appropriateness Index.
