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What is LINK-KID?

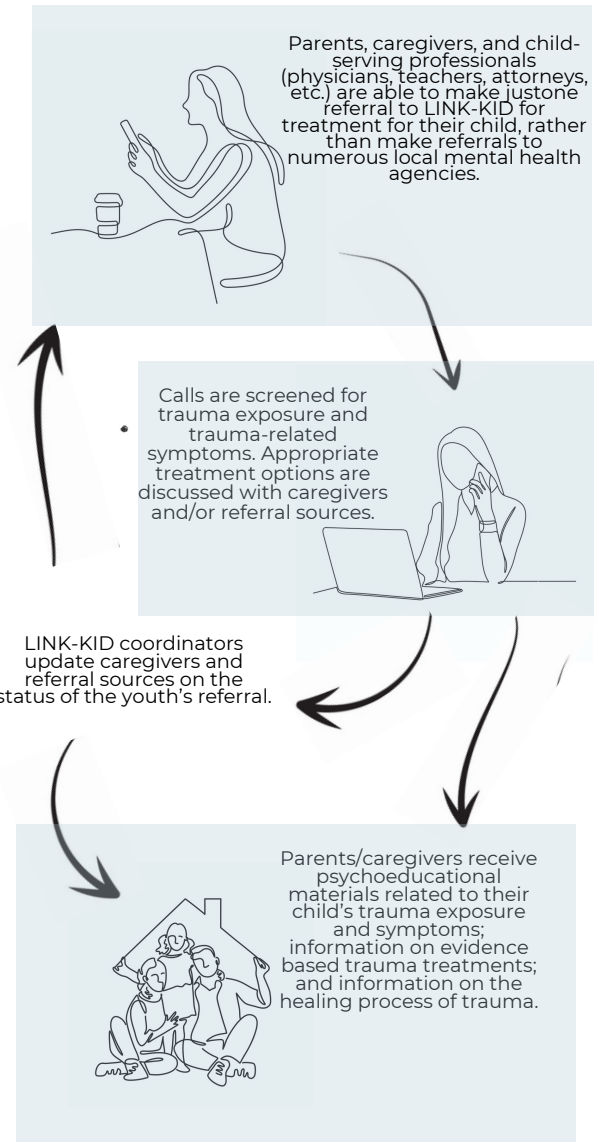
LINK-KID (A Centralized Referral System) provides a single point of access to connect youth (ages 0-25) who may benefit from Evidence-Based Treatments (EBTs) for trauma with providers trained in these treatments. EBTs have research supporting their effectiveness in addressing trauma related symptoms and behaviors.

LINK-KID maintains an active database of providers across the state trained in trauma-focused EBTs, including information about waitlists, language capacity, and insurances accepted.

The primary goal of LINK-KID is to help youth who have experienced trauma to receive treatment in a timely, evidence-based, family focused manner. LINK-KID has been able to reduce wait times for connecting youth with effective treatments and provide support during wait times.

Treatments referred for:

- Child Parent Psychotherapy (CPP)
- Trauma-Focused Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT)
- Parent Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT)
- Attachment, Self-Regulation & Competency (ARC)
- Alternatives for Families: Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy (AF-CBT)



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
