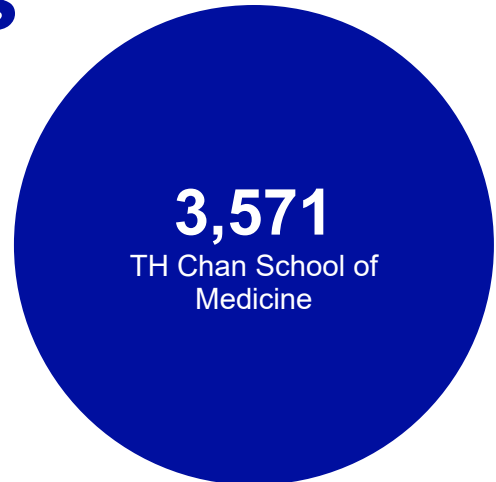
The Office of Faculty Affairs facilitates the review of each UMass Chan department every 5-7 years. In AY 24, the reviews included:

- Horae Gene Therapy Center and Vector Core

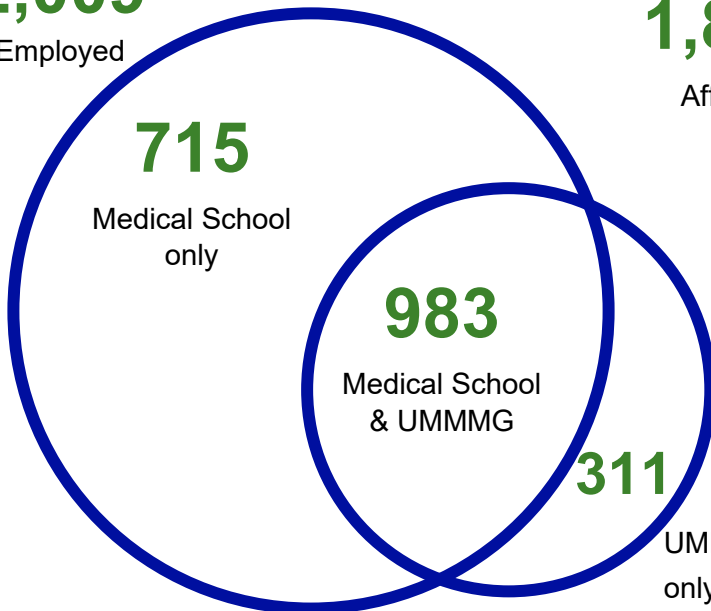

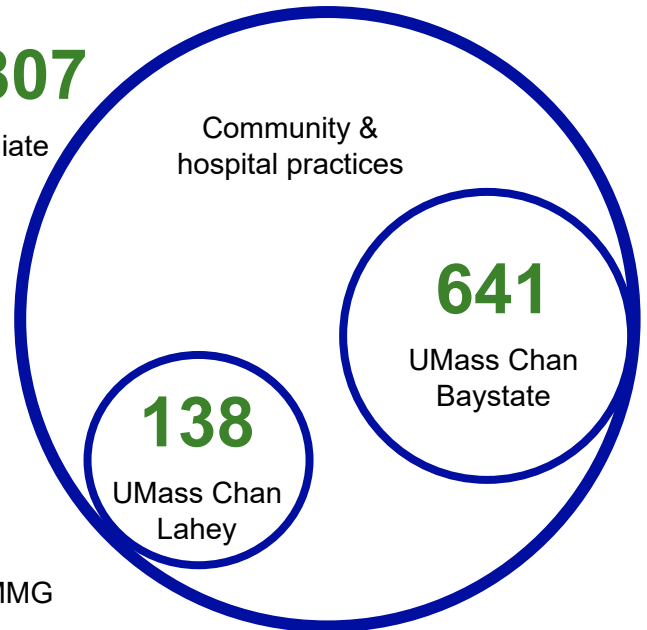

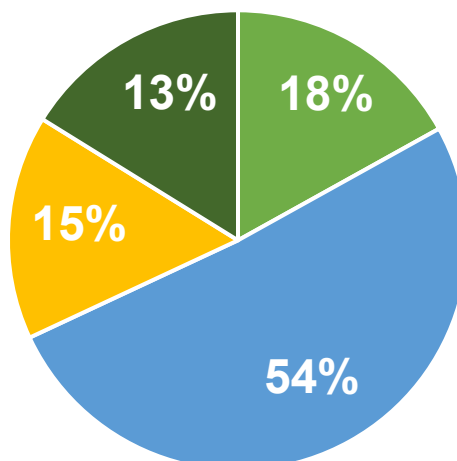

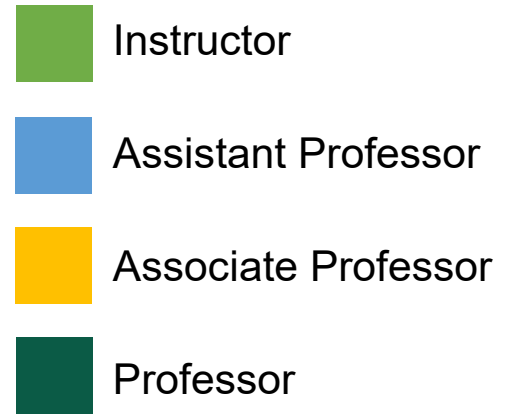
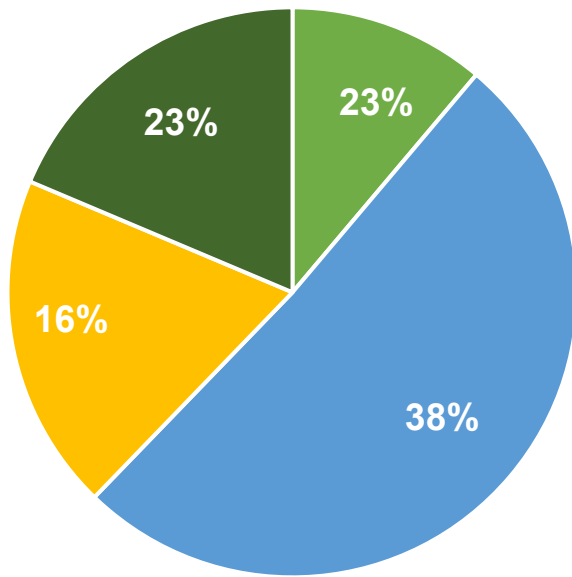


All Faculty

by Rank

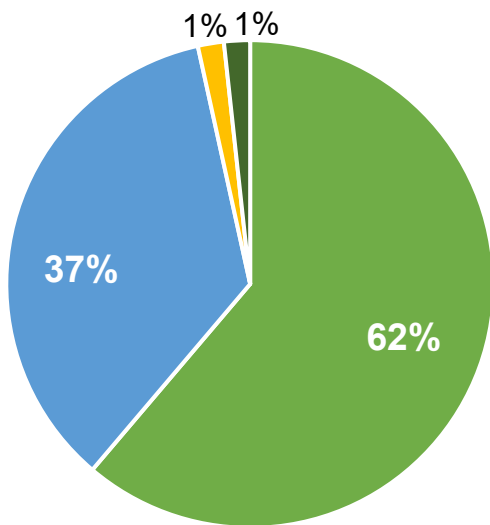

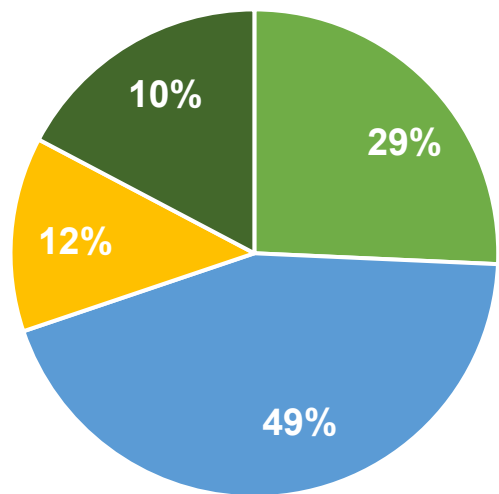
Employed Faculty by Rank



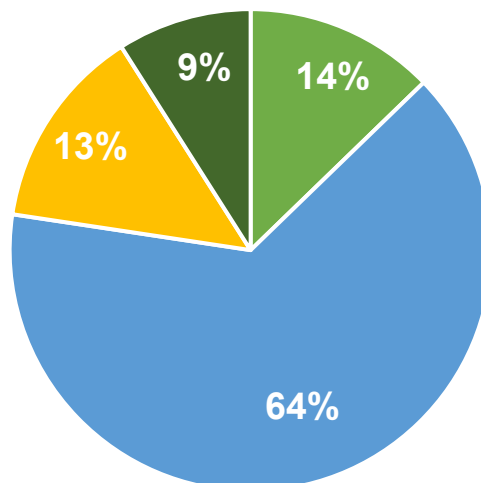

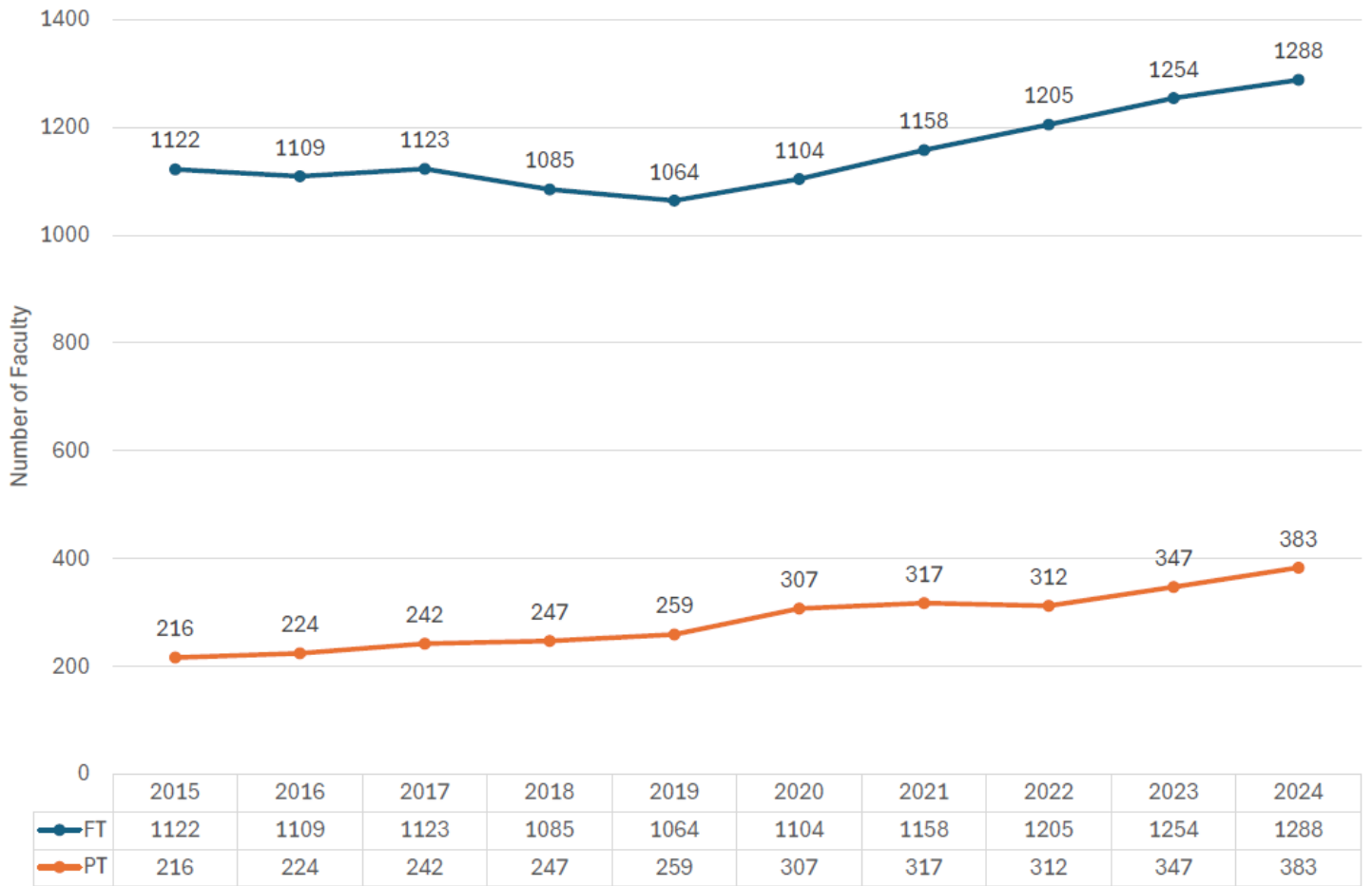

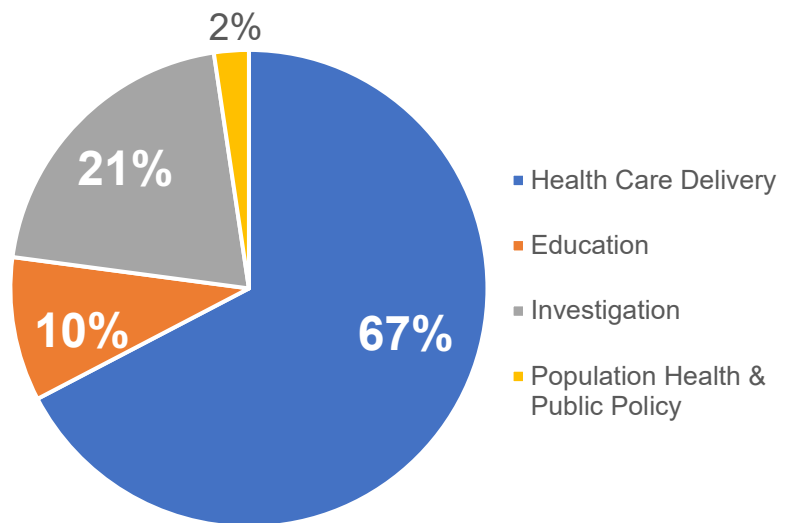

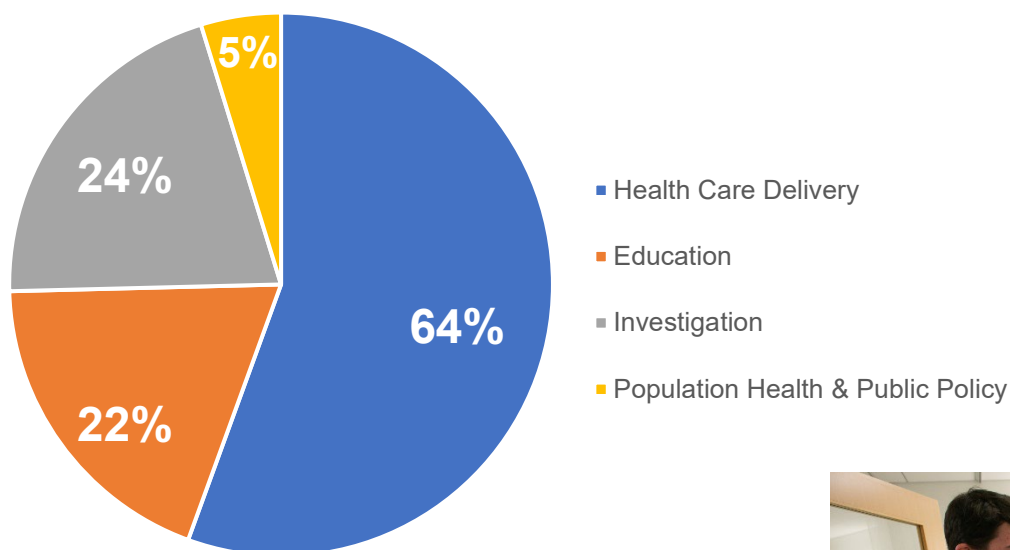

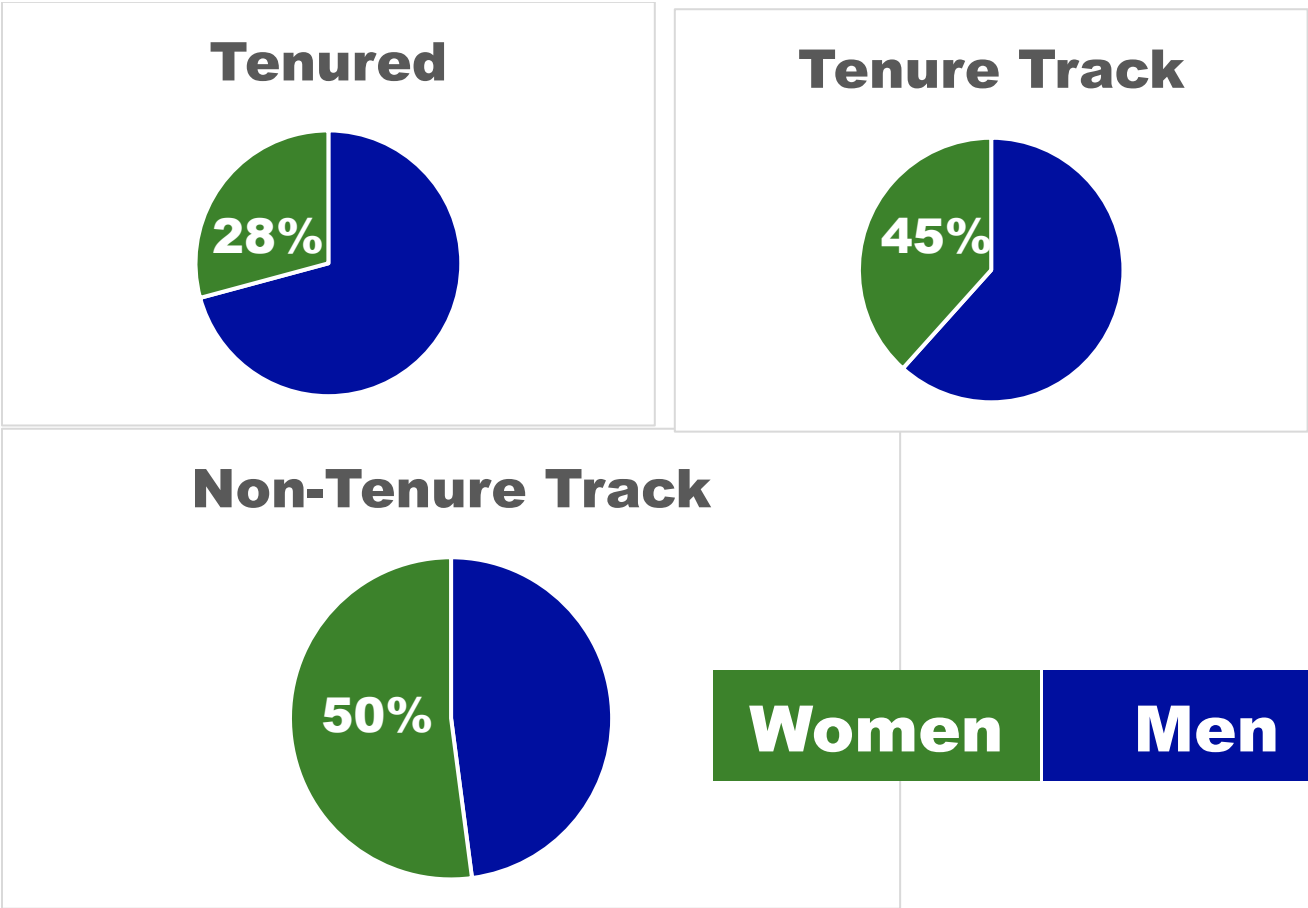

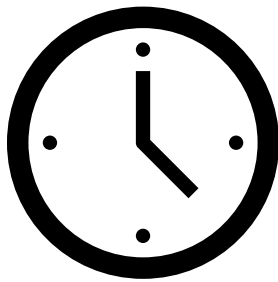
UMass Chan Medical School is a wonderful place to make a career as a faculty member, and the talent and expertise of the faculty across our three schools is truly inspiring!



A Professional Development Roadmap for UMass Chan Faculty



OFA supports faculty in their career planning and helps create professional development “roadmaps” that align with their goals and professional identity as clinicians, educators and researchers.



135 hours of programming facilitated

Programs for New & Junior Faculty

- **New Faculty Orientation** offered 3x per year as a 3-hour virtual program
- **New Faculty Reception** offered annually as an in-person event
- **Junior Faculty Development Program** a weekly cohort-based longitudinal career development program
- **Peers for Promotion** a 6-session program designed to support and prepare Assistant Professors for promotion
- **Investigator Career Advancement Program (iCAP)** a career development program for early career tenure-track faculty *sponsored by the Office of Health Equity*

Programs for Women Faculty

- **EMPOWER Summit** a one-day leadership summit for women faculty
- **Equip** a 6-session communications skills program for women faculty
- **Women's Health Talk** sponsored by the Women's Faculty Committee
- **Women's History Month Talk** sponsored by the Women's Faculty Committee
- **Joy McCann Professorship** a 3-year funded professorship to enhance the professional experience of women faculty

Programs for All Faculty

- **Advance** a monthly virtual program addressing areas in which faculty are evaluated as part of the promotions process including educational effectiveness, scholarship and academic reputation
- **Mentorship Skill Building** various sessions intended for faculty mentors based on the CIMER curriculum
