Who is eligible?

Faculty in any of the three schools – medicine, nursing and biomedical sciences – who hold the rank of associate or full professor and have had an active faculty appointment for at least three years are eligible for nomination.

Nominee Criteria

- Demonstrates a sustained commitment to mentoring faculty, students and/or trainees;
- Has a track record of mentoring multiple individuals who have gone on to enjoy academic and/or professional success;
- Displays the qualities of mentoring through one or more of the following: shares time generously with mentee(s) beyond the expectations of their position; reviews the work of mentee(s) and provides effective feedback; offers counsel, advice and information to support the personal and professional development of their mentee(s); sponsors activities that advance the career of their mentee(s); champions the contributions, efforts and value of their mentee(s);
- Mentors individuals from diverse backgrounds;
- Serves as a role model to fellow colleagues through excellence in mentoring; and
- Enhances the overall culture of mentoring at UMass Chan Medical School.



Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Mentoring

This Chancellor's Award is bestowed annually upon a UMass Chan Medical School associate professor or professor who, through their daily work, exemplifies the role of and demonstrates the qualities associated with an outstanding mentor. Mentorship is a foundational element of the medical, nursing and science professions, and a strong culture of mentoring is essential to the success of UMass Chan and our rich educational and research environment. This award celebrates the fundamental importance of mentoring at all levels (peer, trainee and student) in our academic community and across the health and science professions.

PEERS FOR PROMOTION 2025

Overview

The Peers for Promotion program is a longitudinal cohort program designed to support, motivate, and prepare faculty for the promotions process. By the end of the program, faculty will have 1) an increased understanding of the promotions process, 2) identified tasks to strengthen their promotion materials, and 3) a detailed timeline for submission of those materials. The cohort model allows each participant to give and receive feedback on each of the elements of a promotions package (CV, narrative statement, and letters of evaluation).

The 2025 program will consist of five sessions (one virtual, four in-person).

Overview of the role of scholarship in academic advancement; Discussion of scholarship quantity & quality; Discussion of what "counts" as scholarship; Discussion of strategies to maximize productivity


