Curriculum Committee: 2024 Updates

Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Program

- Competency-based education
 - AACN Essentials and NP competencies
 - Ongoing curriculum mapping of course/learning outcomes
- Clinical hour requirement increase across NP specialties
 - Added 30 clinical hours to Diagnostic Reasoning Course/DNP year 1
 - Added 90 additional clinical hours to current programs
 - Credit neutral for majority of changes



Master of Science (MS) Program: Interprofessional Leadership and Nursing

Program Changes

- Enrollment barrier rectified by removing pre-enrollment statistics course within past 5-years and instead offering a statistics course to the curriculum
- Online track option to be offered beginning Fall 2025
- Program being restructures as an 18-month program instead of 2 years

Direct Entry Masters

- Curriculum based on national standards to prepare nurses for entry to practice.
- Pending BORN approval, Direct Entry Masters will be 62 credits (from 50) over 4 semesters (from 3) with 9 credits at an advanced (graduate) level:
 - Informatics and Healthcare Technologies
 - Evidence-Based Nursing Practice & Scholarship
 - Health Care Systems and Quality
- A modified concepts-based approach
 - reduces extraneous material & trims duplicate content
 - more interactive and engaging which enhances understanding and retention while developing clinical judgement
