



Resources and Services for Benefits and Work Incentives Counseling

Work Without Limits Work Incentives Planning and Assistance (WIPA) — provides one-on-one counseling for SSI/SSDI beneficiaries between the ages of 14 and full retirement age on the impact of work earnings or wage increases on cash benefits (e.g., SSI and SSDI), health insurance (e.g., Medicaid and Medicare), and other public benefits (e.g., subsidized housing and SNAP). To prioritize services for beneficiaries who are most vulnerable to overpayment, and most in need of immediate attention, we serve beneficiaries who are working, self-employed or about to start work full- or part-time; have a job offer; are actively interviewing; or are currently receiving services from a vocational program and/or have a serious intent to work. Beneficiaries must reside in the following counties in Massachusetts (i.e., Middlesex, Worcester, Franklin, Hampshire, Hampden, Berkshire) or New York (i.e., Albany, Greene, Washington, Rensselaer, Schenectady, Schoharie, Washington).

Work Without Limits Employment Network (EN) - is part of the Social Security Ticket to Work program and offers on-going benefits counseling and employment supports for SSI and SSDI beneficiaries who live anywhere in the U.S.A., are currently receiving monthly SSI and/or SSDI payments, have a long-term goal to earn enough money from their full- or part-time job or from self-employment to get off their cash benefits (such as SSI, SSDI and SNAP), and are interested in receiving benefits counseling as they work toward transitioning from receiving cash benefits to supporting themselves through work.
